Holds a PhD from Cambridge University and teaches as Professor of Literature and Gender Studies every Spring semester at Hampshire College, Amherst, USA.

With a long involvement in politics of gender and sexuality, issues of race, ethnicity and cross-cultural dialogue, since 1986 she has worked (the other 7 months each year) developing HIV prevention initiatives, focused on youth, radical interrogations of gender and participative educational methods. Based from Oslo for 10 years she led the Estonia-based NIKK project /LIVING FOR TOMORROW: youth, sexual health, HIV, gender and sex in Nordic/Baltic/N.W. Russian times of transition/. In recent years she has worked on gender/HIV capacity building training for NRC education programmes in Sierra Leone, Uganda, DRC, Burundi, Liberia, Somaliland, Sudan, Azerbaijan, Georgia; with IPPF internationally on gender/SRH, youth/sexuality/faith; with Roma refugees in Serbia for CARE; with students of RCNUWC and medical students in the UK.



### "Protection; Men and Condoms in the time of HIV and AIDS"

Men, Boys and Condom Use is a resource film which is meant to stir discussions on the significance of condoms in Sonke's ongoing HIV prevention initiatives. Avoiding moralising, this creative documentary is filmed from lives of men and boys in South Africa, Kenya and Sierra Leone.

The free DVD includes short pieces explaining condom use and graphic representations of how HIV spreads through unprotected sex across a life timeline. On the DVD, the film can be played in English, French, Portuguese, Swahili, Chichewa, Zulu and Hausa

With its facilitator's guide, the film will be a catalyst for groups to examine the condom issues men encounter in the real contexts of their lives. Although a growing number of people are conscious of the need to use condoms, their acceptance and active use are still far from reality in the lives of many.

Correct, consistent condom use in sex, from teenage years onwards, and across the marriage years, remains a challenge for many men. Along paths of survival, longing, work, or pressures of masculinity, HIV continues to find its way into men's and boy's bodies, and then into their relationships, communities and families. While ARV medications support lives and constrain the spread of HIV once in the body, the goal of preventing the virus from entering bodies in the first place remains key. This film brings into focus the tensions and contradictions that surround condom use, and presents viewers with situations that are familiar in their daily lives. In three sections it shows:

The challenges in caring for a healthy, strong body in a world of HIV: An elderly, respected trainer in a South African boxing club, highly invested in discipline around the body is nevertheless silent about HIV and Aids, despite the fact that sexualized city life are never far away; a young boxer focuses on building a strong HIV free body, to win a world championship and access new possibilities for his family.

In Kenya, a stone carving community comes together to discuss what can be done to stop tradition dying out as result of HIV and Aids . Those who have suffered loss or are living with HIV argue against reservations and call for new approaches to condom use in realities of sexually active lives. In postwar Sierra Leone two young men navigate the world of sexual health in different ways; one is aware of the risk as a result of his parents' involvement in sexual health education; the other is a rising football star with an elderly Muslim father and many girlfriends. Young male friends in the shanty town put forward varying attitudes to condoms.

The film project was inspired by work on gender and HIV that the Norwegian Refugee Council developed with teachers in African post-war, refugee and IDP settings. Funded by the Norwegian Government (Norad), it is being made by an award-winning South African film team and Sonke has welcomed the initiative into its work with men and boys across Africa to reduce the impact of HIV and address the challenges of condom use in the era of HIV and Aids.
