For many years, the Arab world has looked as a region, which is not ripe for freedom and democracy. Suddenly, a strong wind of change swept most of the region. First fell the unpopular regime in Tunisia. Soon after, the protesters from the Tahrir Square forced the Egyptian dictator Hosni Mubarak to resign. The popular uprising in Libya led to a month long civil war with many casualties. The strong repression of the Syrian regime has stressed that some Arab dictatorships are not willing to listen to the voice of the people and resign.

What are the social forces laying beyond the dramatic changes in the Arab world? Is it of a new generation of well-educated youth? Are the uprisings the result of the expansion of new forms of communications such as twitter and the Internet? Are we witnessing a new era of a strong civil society and popular involvement in the rule of the Arab countries? The seminar will address these issues....
