Participants themselves arrange their **own travel and accommodation**. Below, we give some recommendations regarding these practical aspects.

The Ørecomm Festival does **not** provide economic support for participants. We sincerely hope that participants from many countries of the world will take part and encourage you to apply for funding from other sources.

Roskilde

Roskilde University is geographically located about 30 minutes by train outside Copenhagen and yet not in the city of Roskilde, on what back in the days (opened in 1972) used to be nothing but fields. The university is research-driven and provides education for future generations of managers, teachers and experts based on advanced knowledge. The most important task of Roskilde University is to contribute to experimental, innovative forms of learning and knowledge creation. For more details on Roskilde University, [check here](#).

While in Roskilde the Festival is hosted by the [Department of Communication, Business and Information Technologies](#) (CBIT). CBIT is an innovative and interdisciplinary university environment that combines science, the social sciences and humanities in the study of the interplay between communication, business and information technology in theory and in practice. The conference on **14 September** is being held at the cinema (it says 'biograf' on the map) in building 41. Please [see the map](#) of Roskilde University.

Roskilde University is not located in the city of Roskilde as one might think, but near the railway station called Trekroner. Therefore you need to take the train from Copenhagen Central Station to Trekroner. On **14 September** we will meet at Copenhagen Central Station at 8:00 am, go by train, and walk together from Trekroner Station to Roskilde University. Meeting point is at the stairs to track 8.

Malmö

Malmö University is located in the centre of Malmö in an area of transformation of Malmö from an industrial town to a centre of learning. Malmö is located in southern Sweden, close to Copenhagen in Denmark. The university is structured to cope with our ever-changing labour market through a multi-disciplinary approach that crosses traditional school and faculty boundaries. Malmö University offers more than 90 separate education programmes at bachelor and master's level and 500 courses. Around 20 programmes and 90 courses are in English, attracting almost 2000 international students. In total, we have 25 000 full or part-time students.

While in Malmö the Örecomm Festival is hosted by the School of Arts and Communication at the Faculty for Culture and Society.

Copenhagen

The conference on **17 September** will take place in central Copenhagen at the NGO *Action Aid Denmark*, at Fælledvej 12, in conference room "Møderiet". *Action Aid* is located approximately 10 minutes walk from Nørrebro station. See [this map](#) over central Copenhagen, where the route between Nørreport Station and Action Aid Denmark is highlighted in blue.

Accommodation

We recommend staying in **Malmö 14-16 September**, and staying over in **Copenhagen the night 16 to 17 September**.

Travel

Malmö is located only 20 min train ride from Copenhagen airport Kastrup, so if travelling by air, you can easily arrange both your arrival and departure for Copenhagen airport.

On **14 September**, Festival participants are invited to go together as a group to Roskilde University. We will meet at Copenhagen Central Station at **8:00 am, on the platform by track 8**.

Similarly, we will meet at **8:00 am** at the Copenhagen Central Station on **15 September** to go together to Malmö, **on the platform by track 6**.

Fees for students:

1 day: 75 SEK (8,50 Euro, 62 DKK)

4 days: 250 SEK (28 Euro, 207 DKK)

Fees for others:

1 day: 100 SEK (11 Euro, 83 DKK)

4 days: 350 SEK (39 Euro, 290 DKK)
